

## **INTRODUCTION**

This course is written seeks to an expositional, biblical ground and theological basis for mission in order to prepare students for the great task of spreading the message of the Gospel throughout the world. It is my prayer that they might not only be in a church founded by missionaries, but they might themselves go out to found other churches in the this world.

## **COURSE CONTENT**

The course is divided into eight lessons and has two major parts. Part 1 (Lessons One - Four) argues that Mission is a work of the Triune God with each member taking specific roles. Part 2 (Lessons Five - Eight) stresses man's responsibility in mission. We will focus particularly on the life of the apostle Paul, a Jewish missionary to the Gentiles, and the relationship between the church and mission.

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

The course is designed to give students a principle scriptural and detailed understanding of the material and to encourage students to read original material in the field of apologetics. It is hoped that the course will help students develop the apologetic skills needed to defend the faith to unbelievers.

## **BENEFITS OF THIS COURSE**

The course teaches students the basic principles of defending the faith and of how to expose and exploit the deceptions that the unbeliever is laboring under. It also helps define what our responsibility is in defending the Gospel.
